The program provides free hands-on coaching and digital skills training to help Black and Latino small businesses reach new customers, thrive online, and grow. scholarships to help people grow their careers in the digital economy



provided to underrepresented startup founders <u>Google Career Certificates</u> offer self-paced, online job training that prepares people for careers in fast-growing fields of data analytics, IT support, project management, and user experience (UX) design. Google has provided 100,000 scholarships to help more people access these certificates to grow their careers. Since launching in 2018, over 50,000 people have earned a Google Career Certificate and 82% of U.S. graduates report a positive career impact within six months of completion. More than half of those graduates identify as Black, Latino, female, or veteran. Learn more at grow.google/skills.

In 2020, <u>Google for Startups</u> launched our first **Black Founders Fund**, and in 2021 we announced our first **Latino Founders Fund**, totaling **\$15M** combined. This has already created a halo effect by helping founders raise an additional \$50M in venture capital. Recipients include **Provider Pool** in St. Louis.

Supporting Missouri nonprofits and local organizations

We know that organizations are already doing great work in Missouri. That's why Google has partnered with trusted community institutions across the state to bring digital skills training, grant funding, and other resources and services to more Missourians, including those historically underserved.

Missouri nonprofits

<u>Google for Nonprofits</u> provides nonprofit organizations across the U.S. with access to Google products like Google Workspace for Nonprofits, Google Ad Grants, YouTube, and Google Maps Platform. Since 2011, Google for Nonprofits has supported more than **3,600** nonprofits in Missouri. In 2020, Google provided **\$10.23M** in in-kind search advertising credit to Missouri nonprofits through the <u>Google Ad Grants</u> program.

Google.org has awarded over **\$726K** in grants to nonprofits and organizations that impact Missouri, including the **Veterans of Foreign Wars** to improve college attainment rates for veterans.

To date, Google employees — with matching contributions from Google — have donated **\$478K+** in charitable giving to Missouri nonprofits.

Free high-speed internet service provided to Kansas City residents

<u>Google Fiber</u> has provided high-speed, high-bandwidth internet services to the Greater Kansas City area — Google Fiber's first market — and eight Missouri municipalities since 2012. **200+** Missouri schools, libraries, community centers, municipal facilities, and nonprofits receive **Google Fiber gigabit internet service at no cost** through the Community Connections program. Additionally, residents at 835 housing units in Kansas City receive gigabit internet service at no cost through the Gigabit Communities program.
