Helping Hawaii residents develop digital skills to grow their careers

50% of the workforce will need to reskill by 2025¹ and 1 in 3 American workers have very limited or no digital skills.² We're working to help people advance their careers and pursue new opportunities by making digital skills accessible to everyone. To date, we have helped over 300,000 Americans find new employment and increase their income through digital skills training.

<u>Google Career Certificates</u> help people develop skills for new jobs in fields like cybersecurity, data analytics, project management, and more in just three to six months. After completing the program, graduates are able to connect with 150+ top employers. 75% of graduates report a positive career outcome within six months.³

Google has also partnered with Hawaii educational institutions like Hawai'i Pacific University and University of Hawaii to make Google Career Certificates available to students and to increase employment opportunities.

Google is helping address inequities in computer science education by offering no-cost products and programs, like <u>CS</u> <u>First</u> and <u>Code Next</u>, to students across the U.S. To date, Google has invested over \$263 million toward computer science skilling including Google.org grants to organizations like National 4H Council and Hidden Genius Project.
