Helping lowa businesses and job seekers

For years, Google has supported digital skilling programs that can help sustain small businesses and help people secure fast-growing, good-paying jobs. With so many U.S. workers displaced by the COVID-19 pandemic, these solutions are even more critical to economic recovery. Technology creates growth opportunities for American businesses and can help American workers develop the skills they need to succeed in the digital economy.

Iowans enrolled in the Google IT Support Certificate program In collaboration with Opportunity Finance Network (OFN), Google made a **\$180M** commitment to support underserved small businesses across the country through the <u>Grow with Google Small Business Fund</u> and <u>Google.org Grants program</u>. The fund delivers low-interest loans to community development financial institutions (CDFIs).

Google is invested in expanding access to <u>Google Career Certificates</u> to help more people—particularly underserved—grow their careers. To date, the <u>Google IT Support Certificate</u> has been implemented through 100+ community colleges and dozens of career technical education sites. **1K+ Iowans** have enrolled in the program and **60%** of people who take the Google IT Support Certificate course are Black, Latino, women, or veterans.

Supporting Iowa nonprofits and local organizations

We know that organizations are already doing great work in lowa. That's why Google has partnered with trusted community institutions across the state to bring digital skills training, grant funding and other resources and services to more lowans, including those historically underserved.

lowa students receive hands-on learning opportunities in STEM Google.org has awarded over **\$2M** in grants to nonprofits and organizations based in lowa, including through the local <u>Google.org Impact Challenge Iowa</u>. This funding has helped train incarcerated individuals to become software developers, supported rehabilitation programs for young adults, and helped local nonprofits and schools in lowa. Additionally, as part of a \$10M grant committed to Goodwill Industries International, Google.org supports the local **Goodwill chapter: Goodwill Industries of the Heartland**.

To support COVID-19 relief in the state, Google provided \$50K to the Southwest Iowa COVID-19 Response Fund in 2020, created in part by the Iowa West Foundation and the Pottawattamie County Community Foundation. This funding supported a range of efforts including public health resources and emergency childcare in the area.

Since 2009, Google employees based in lowa—with matching contributions from Google—have donated over **\$1M** in charitable giving to nonprofits. Since 2012, Google employees in lowa have also served **5,300+ hours of volunteer and pro bono work** with local nonprofits and organizations.

In partnership with the City of Council Bluffs, Google helped launch a free Wi-Fi network in 2011, the **BLink-Bluffs Free Community Wi-Fi** program, for everyone in and around Council Bluffs.

Google's long-term commitments to buy renewable energy in lowa have spurred the construction of **nearly \$510M** in **new energy infrastructure** in the state over the past decade. These energy investments have helped increase economic opportunity and job creation in rural lowa.

<u>Google for Nonprofits</u> provides organizations across the U.S. with access to Google products and programs such as Google Workspace for Nonprofits, Google Ad Grants, YouTube, and Google Maps Platform. Since 2011, Google for Nonprofits has supported **1,400+ nonprofits** in lowa. In 2020, Google provided **\$3.2M of in in-kind search** advertising credit to lowa nonprofits through the <u>Google Ad Grants</u> program.

Grow with Google has partnered with 160+ organizations in the state to train tens of thousands of lowans on <u>digital skills</u>, including public libraries, chambers of commerce, and more.

Google has supported STEM learning for **1K+** lowa students through hands-on learning opportunities like the <u>Anti-Gravity Games</u> and <u>CS First</u> coding events.
