in grants to nonprofits and organizations based in New Hampshire Since 2009, Google has awarded **\$9M+** in grants to nonprofits and organizations based in New Hampshire, including **US FIRST** to sponsor robotic events and **Southern New Hampshire University** to develop a competency-based assessment to help develop soft-skills in youth.

Since 2005, Google employees based in New Hampshire—with matching contributions from Google—have donated **\$1M+** in charitable giving to nonprofits. Since 2012, Google employees in New Hampshire have also served **3,200+ hours of volunteer and pro bono work** with local nonprofits and organizations.
